

# JUNE ROSE AND BLOOM SHOW 2026



All members are encouraged to enter exhibits in categories 1 – 21 from plants grown in your garden, decks or patio pots, but not purchased. Novice members are encouraged to enter floral arrangements in classes 22 -24 using flowers/greenery grown or purchased. Advanced members should enter in classes 25 – 28.

CLASS	DESCRIPTION
1	Red Rose – 1 bloom
2	Pink rose – 1 bloom
3	Peace Rose any colour – 1 bloom
4	Container of Roses, each a different variety – 5 blooms
5	Hybrid Tea Rose – 1 bloom, any colour except red or pink
6	Rambler or Climbing Rose – 1 lateral
7	Floribunda Rose – 1 cut
8	Miniature rose – 1 cut
9	Shrub or Carpet Rose – 1 cut minimum length 8”
10	Sweet Peas c.v.a.- 5 stems (not perennial variety)
11	Any other Annual- 1stem
12	Any other Perennial not listed NOT ROSES – 5 stems
13	Foxglove- 1cut
14	Peony – 1 bloom
15	Sedum – 3 stems
16	Clematis – 3 blooms floating
17	Astrantia c.v.a. - 3 cuts
18	Hosta leaf 10” and over (large) 1 leaf in water
19	Hosta leaf 6-9” (medium) 1 leaf in water
20	Hosta leaf 2-5” (small) 1 leaf in water
21	Rhubarb – 3 stalks

## FLORAL ART – NOVICE

22	FRIENDS – a synergistic arrangement using “similar” containers, not “identical” Use same flowers in each one.
23	TIMELESS DESIGN - use various roses and baby’s breath
24	IN HIGH SPIRITS – make flowers a “Colour Blast” vertical design 17” high for a 7” vase.

## FLORAL ART – ADVANCED

25	DINNER PLATE – a design using colourful vegetable leaves.
26	FULL FLAVOUR – use herbs in a cooking vessel. Name herbs.
27	DRIFTWOOD – a design from nature using bark, rocks, moss, critters and flowers
28	HUMMINGBIRD HAVEN – a hanging arrangement of trumpet shaped flowers
